proto (first)	prototype, proton, protohuman, protoderm
phon (sound)	symphony, telephone, cellphone, phonetic, cacophony, microphone, euphony
mono (one)	monotonous, monotone, monopoly, monogamy, monogram, monorail, monotheism
viv (life)	vivid, vivacious, revive, survive, convivial, vivisect

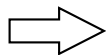

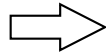
